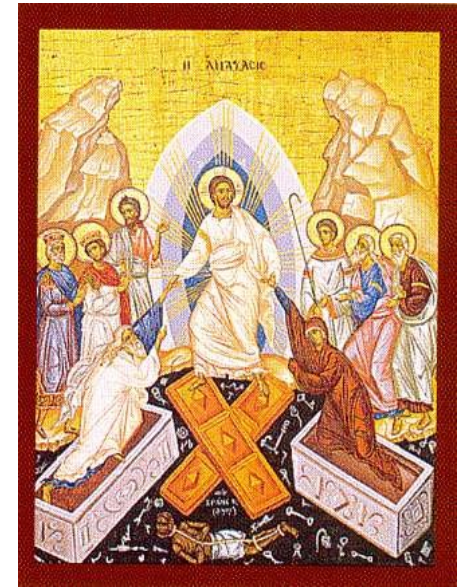

The President Tadic informed the representatives of the Church that the Society for building the St Sava Cathedral on Vrchar, which is presided by him, will make efforts in following period in order to finish the cathedral.

#### **Bishop Irinej attends Name Day Celebration of Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew I at The Phanar**

While visiting The City of Constantinople and The Great Church of Christ, 10-11 June 2009, His Grace Bishop Irinej of Australia and New Zealand attended the Name Day Celebration of His All Holiness the Archbishop of Constantinople, New Rome and Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew I.

Representatives from throughout the Orthodox world gathered at the Ecumenical Patriarchate in Constantinople to honour Patriarch Bartholomew on the celebration of his patronal feast, the Holy Apostle Bartholomew. The distinguished list of delegates and guests, which included representatives of the various local Orthodox Churches, as well as members of the Diplomatic and Consular Corps and Archons of the Ecumenical Throne, was headed by His Beatitude Hieronymos II, Archbishop of Athens and All Greece and Primate of the Autocephalous Orthodox Church of Greece.

### **SCHOOLS PLAN CLOSER ACADEMIC RELATIONSHIP**

**Crestwood, NY** - Discussions on closer academic relationships between St. Vladimir's Orthodox Theological Seminary and the Theological Faculty of the University of Belgrade, Serbia, took place in Crestwood, New York, on June 2nd and 3rd, 2009. Recognizing mutual academic and ecclesial benefits, the representatives of two institutions (Professor Fr. Vladan Perisic and Bishop Maxim Vasiljevic from Belgrade and Fr. John Behr, Fr. Chad Hatfield and Prof. John Barnett from St. Vladimir's) discussed formal relationship guidelines and conditions for a joint enterprise on master level. Among the programs being considered are: a) student exchange program b) lectures of visiting professors for both schools c) joint conferences and d) joint publications

These fully accredited educational institutions plan to begin the implementation of this project as soon as the Fall 2010.
